## 2014 ~ LOOKING BACK, LOOKING AHEAD ~ 2015

The last half of 2013 and all of 2014 saw the Friends of Plant Conservation take a leap forward in its' role of supporting the NC Plant Conservation Program. Fundraising efforts have resulted in a stable fund for supporting temporary field technicians when they take a mandatory, unpaid 30-day leave each 12 months. We also, with your help and a generous hand from an anonymous Friend, completed fundraising to secure the Caraway Tract for the protection of *Shortia galacifolia* var. *brevistyla*. The paperwork continues and we hope the project will be completed in the coming months.

### **MEMBERSHIP**

Under the leadership of Gary Wein, FoPC established a new membership year (July 1 – June 30) that avoids end of year activities. He also created membership renewal envelopes which have proven to be successful. Membership growth continues, thanks to Gary's efforts as well as other board members and the general increasing visibility of FoPC.

### PCP PRESERVE TOURS AND EDUCATION

During the course of the year, PCP and FoPC offered tours of Cedar Mountain Bog, Pondberry Bay, Caraway Tract (proposed preserve), Morgan's Bluff, Hebron Road, Redlair, Picture Creek Barrens, and to a hardwood forest upstream of Penny's Bend. Members of the public were also invited to participate in these events. The schedule of tours for 2015 is at the end of this newsletter.

### **REDLAIR PRESERVE**

The new PCP Redlair Stewardship Committee continues to meet to provide land management recommendations. The Redlair Foundation Board directs the endowment created by the Rankin Family for the management of Redlair Preserve. Members of the Board include Haywood Rankin, Katherine Rankin, Johanna Rankin; Dave Cable; Tom Okel; Bob Peet; Katherine Schlosser; David Welch.

The dedication of Redlair as PCPs newest Preserve was organized by FoPC and featured comments from Dr. Richard Reich (NCDA&CS),

### ENDANGERED PLANTS DAY - MAY

Activities for the day included a field trip in the morning to the Eno Diabiase Preserve, during which a previously unknown population of *Rhus michauxii* was found by Lesley Starke. Lunch at NCBG followed; then an afternoon symposium featuring Misty Buchanan, Rob Evans, Johnny Randall, and Herb Amyx. After the symposium, participants were invited to assist with planting seeds of *Echinacea laevigata*.

### PRESERVE STEWARDS

Herb and Pat Amyx continue their work at Hebron Road. Kathy Schlosser and Mimi Westervelt continue their work at Harvest Field. Jean Woods continues her work at Cedar Mountain Bog (Bog remains closed to foot traffic). Haywood Rankin works daily on

## ANNUAL MEETING 2014

FOPC LICENSE TAG Work continued over the year to get legislative approval for a license tag featuring Venus flytraps. If approved, funds raised by sale of the plates will support land acquisition and management needs of PCP. Dennis Neimeyer has been assisting with this effort, and Johnny Randall (NCBG) has offered to help us make considerable headway with sales if the legislature approves.

### CARAWAY/OCONEE BELLS TRACT

Work has proceeded to complete a transaction that will protect one of the two remaining populations of *Shortia galacifolia* var. *brevistyla*, Oconee bells. Fundraising by FoPC continued, achieving our goal in the earliest days of 2015. Dave Cable (Trees Charlotte) has worked with us toward the completion of this effort. We hope to make an announcement in the coming months.

### ANNUAL APPEAL

For the past 3 years, our annual appeal has sought

funds to provide assistance to PCP temporary field specialists. These employees are essential to PCP's stewardship efforts across the state. However, they receive low wages, limited benefits, and are required to take a mandatory, unpaid 30-day leave. For those who will return to PCP, we will offer a check to help them through their required leave. An unexpected anonymous donation allows us to now turn our full attention to fundraising for land acquisition and management.



### **BOARD MEETINGS**

Board meetings changed slightly, increasing the opportunity for face-to-face meetings and membership participation. The quarterly meetings will move around the state, with a goal of having meetings in the far western part of the state, foothills area, Piedmont, southern Piedmont, and coastal plain.

The Board welcomed new members Walter Clark, Catherine Luckenbaugh, Charlie Williams, and Alice Zawadzki. We said good-bye to Camille Collins, who leaves us to start her family. Paul Hosier serves in an advisory capacity as our past president, and we look forward to his continued guidance.
